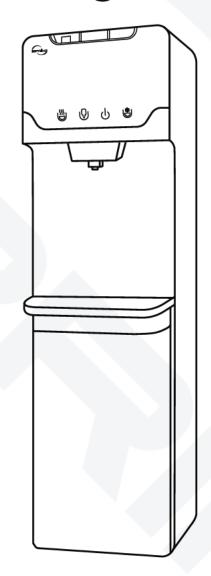

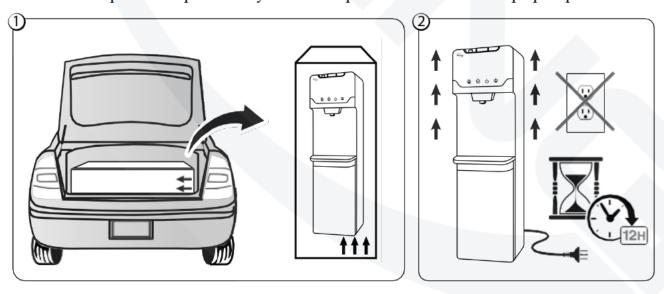

User Information

The user must adhere to the installation specifications described in this Product Installation and Operation Manual (hereinafter referred to as the "instruction manual"). iSpring is not responsible for damage, loss, or injury resulting from neglect, improper maintenance, or unauthorized modification of the unit.

- The unit should be placed only on flat surfaces. Do not mount on a wall.
- Use only authorized iSpring parts. Using unauthorized or aftermarket components will void the product warranty.
- Unauthorized modification and disassembly are strictly prohibited and will void the warranty.
- Never touch the power cord connector when your hands are wet, as this may result in electric shock.
- Never turn the dispenser upside down or tilt it more than 45 degrees. If the unit has been resting on
 its side for a long time, place the water dispenser in the upright position for approximately 12 hours
 before turning it on.
- Never use this dispenser with water that is unsafe to drink or is from an unknownsource.
- This water dispenser is equipped with a grounded power cord plug for your safety.
- Keep your water dispenser in a dry place away from direct sunlight.
- Leave a minimum of 2" (5 cm) around the back and sides of the dispenser for proper ventilation.
- Always install your water dispenser on a level floor. Please wait 3 minutes before restarting the machine after shutting it down.
- Always unplug the water dispenser before servicing.
- Regular cleaning of your water dispenser is required for your warranty. Please follow the cleaning
 instructions outlined in this manual and clean the dispenser every four months.
- The lower front panel must permanently be installed/positioned on the unit for proper operation.

Caution

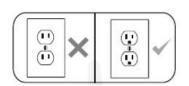
- Never allow children to dispense hot water without proper and direct supervision.
- Do not plug in or turn on the water dispenser unless there is water in the system.
- Refrigerants must be handled and disposed of by qualified service personnel only. Before discarding this water dispenser to landfill, contact local authorities for advice on proper disposal methods for refrigerants.

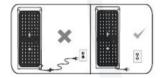


- Never put anything flammable close to the dispenser.
- This water dispenser is designed for indoor applications only.
- Electric shock hazard: Do not overload sockets or extension cords.
- Do not damage the refrigeration cooling system.
- Do not touch the plug with wet hands to prevent electric shock.
- Always disconnect the power cord before attempting to clean or move the dispenser.
- ELECTRICAL REQUIREMENTS:

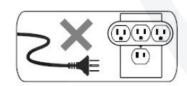
A 115 Volt, 60 Hz., AC only 15 amperes fused, grounded electrical supply is required. It is recommended that a separate circuit serving only your Water Dispenser be provided. Use an outlet that a switch cannot turn off.

■ GROUNDING INSTRUCTIONS:











- This appliance must be grounded. In an electrical short circuit, grounding reduces the risk of electric shock by providing an escape wire for electric current.
- Improper use of the grounding plug can result in a risk of property damage, the electric shock causing severe injury, even death.
- This appliance is equipped with a power cord having a grounding wire with a grounding plug and must be connected into an adequately grounded polarized outlet. Consult a qualified electrician if the grounding instructions are not entirely understood or if doubt exists as to whether the wall outlet is properly grounded.
- If the wall outlet is a standard two prong outlet, it is your responsibility and obligation to have it replaced with a properly grounded 3-prong wall outlet.
- Do not under any circumstances cut or remove the third (ground) pin from the power cord plug.
- Do not use adapter plugs or extension cords with this appliance.
- If the power cord is too short, have aqualified electrician install an electrical outlet near the machine.
- Do NOT use the machine if the power cord becomes frayed or otherwise damaged.

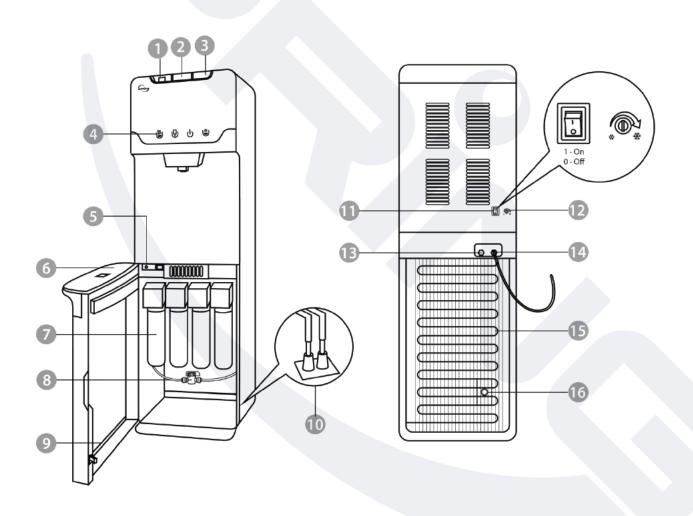

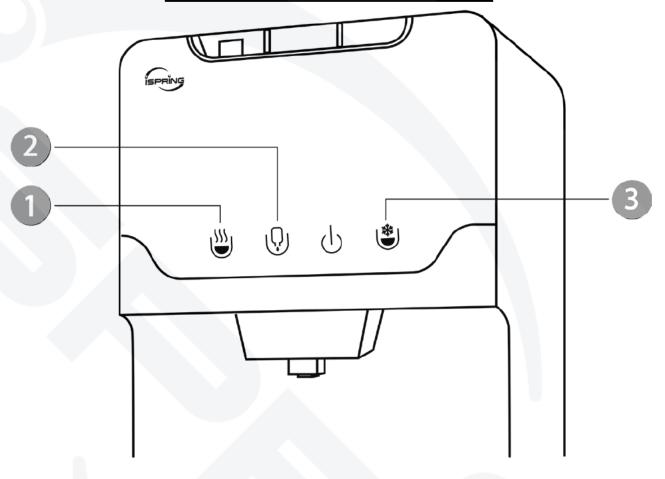
- 1. Hot Water Push Button (with Child Safety Lock)
- 2. Room Temperature Water Push Button
- 3. Cold Water Push Button
- 4. LED (Ready-to-Dispense Indicator Lights)
 - Red = Hot Water
 - Yellow = Water Levels
 - Blue = Cold Water
- 5. Door Switch (Controls System Operation)
- 6. Removable Drip Tray & Grill
- 7. Filters (1st stage \rightarrow 4th stage: left \rightarrow right)
- 8. Inline Ball Valve (ABV1K)
- 9. Lower Front Door

NOTE: Door must always be closed for proper operation

- 10. Leak-detect Sensor
- 11. Hot Water Switch (red)
- 12. Adjustable Cold Water Control

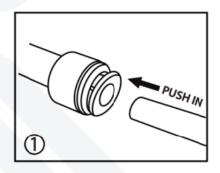

2	Yellow LED Light (Water Level)		Water levels inside the reservoir are low. Check the water inlet and the valves.	Water levels inside the reservoir are normal.

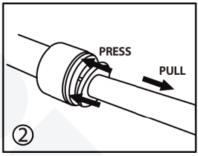


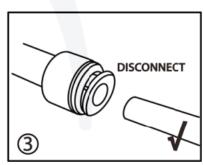




HOW TO DISCONNECT







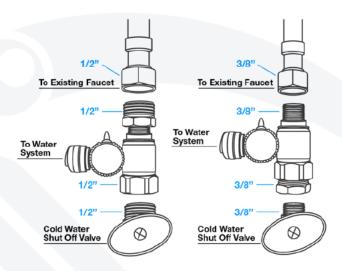
It is highly recommended that you watch the video "How to Connect and Disconnect Quick Connect Fittings | DIY Installation" on YouTube.

Cut the tubing end squarely using a utility knife or scissors. Insert the tubing into the quick connect fitting for at least 1/2". You will need to wiggle the tube and apply additional pressure to create a seal.

(2) Install Feed Water Adapter (AFW43) (Optional)

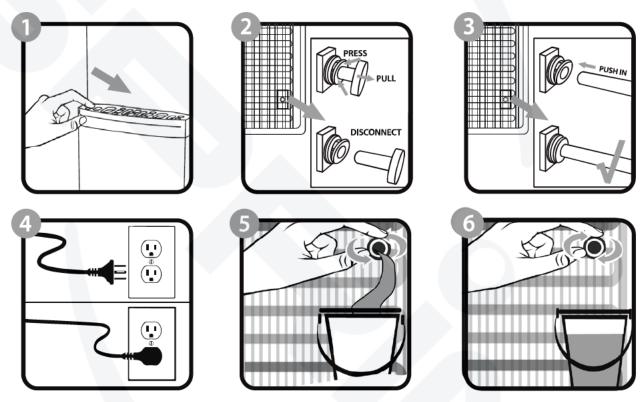
It is highly recommended that you watch the video "How to Install a Feed Water Adapter for Reverse Osmosis (RO) and Other Applications | iSpring AFW43" on YouTube.

- Step 1. Turn off the Cold Water Supply Valve (CWSV) under the sink and open the kitchen faucet to release pressure. Get a towel or bucket to catch any water drips. Disconnect the kitchen faucet connector pipe from the CWSV.
- **Step 2.** Install the Feed Water Adapter onto the CWSV and tighten it using a wrench or pliers. Make sure the O-ring is seated inside the adaptor.
- Step 3. Re-install the kitchen faucet connector pipe onto the male end of the Feed Water Adapter. Turn the handle of the Feed Water Adapter to the perpendicular OFF position. Turn on the CWSV slowly, and ensure you get a proper seal.
- **Step 4.** Connect the 1/4" tubing to the Feed Water Adapter.



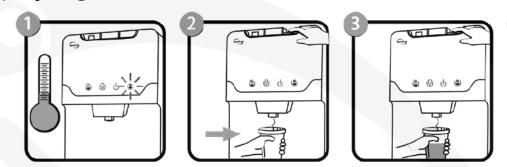
The included bushing can be threaded on either side of the Feed Water Adapter to fit the configuration of both 3/8" COMP and 1/2" NPT.

(3) Installation



- **Step 1.** Choose a suitable location for the system. It must be placed on a flat surface.
- Step 2. Install the Removable Drip Tray & Grill at the front of the system.
- Step 3. Insert the 1/4" tube into the 1/4" water inlet (page 6 #16) at the back of the system.
- Step 4. Plug in the **power cord (page 6 #14)** to the power socket at the **back** of the system. Vibrations can be expected as the system starts.
- Step 5. Turn the handle of the Feed Water Adapter (AFW43) to the parallel ON position if installed. Turn on the Inline Ball Valve (ABV1K) (page 6 #8) slowly if closed, and close the Lower Front Door (page 6 #9).
- Step 6. Prepare a bucket, remove Drain Line Cap (page 6 #13) at the back of the system, and let it run for at least 5 minutes and until the water is clean to flush the system. This should be done each time the filters are changed.
- Step 7. Once the rinsing is completed, screw back the Drain Line Cap (page 6 #13).
- Step 8. Activate the hot water (red) switch (page 6 #11) at the back of the unit if you want to turn on the heating system.
- **Step 9.** The system is ready for use (see <u>Control Panel LED Light Functions</u> for more details, page 7).

(4) Dispensing Cold Water

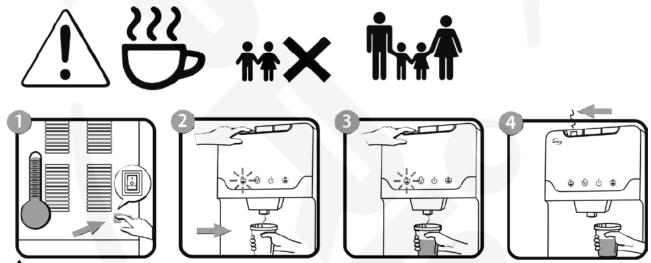


This Water Dispenser left the factory with the cold water temperature control default setting for Energy Star compliance. This setting will deliver cold water temperatures between 4°C - 8°C (39°F - 46°F). The temperature can be adjusted. Using a screwdriver, turn the dial clockwise between "*" (cold) and



" (colder) until the desired temperature is reached.

(5) Dispensing Hot Water



△Warning: Hot water temperatures can reach 94°C/201°F and produce severe scalding. Never let children dispense water without direct adult supervision.

NOTE: The hot water temperature is factory set and cannot be adjusted.

(6) Going Away on Vacation

To conserve energy, unplug the dispenser and drain the reservoirs when not using the dispenser for long periods or when going on vacation (see <u>Draining the Reservoirs</u>, page 11). Follow Initial Product Cleaning Procedures upon return and startup of the dispenser.

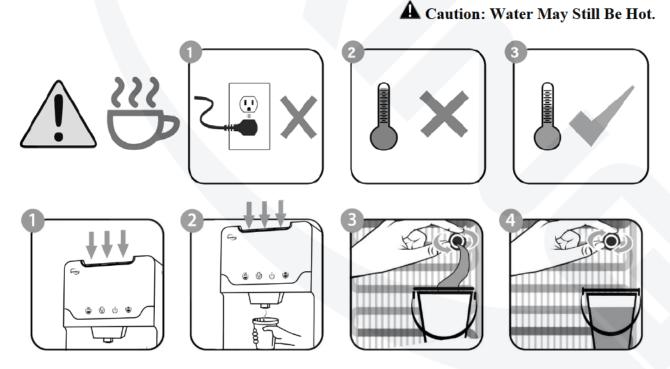
■ Cleaning the Outside of the Water Dispenser



■ Cleaning the Drip Tray

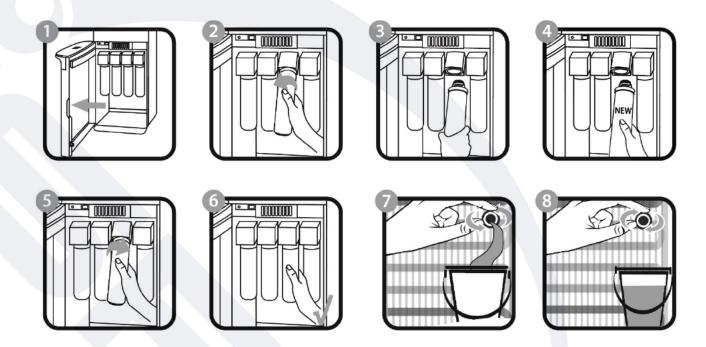


■ Draining the Reservoirs

■ Changing the Filters



- Step 1. Open the Lower Front Door (page 6 #9).
- Step 2. Turn off the Inline Ball Valve (ABV1K) (page 6 #8).
- Step 3. Drain the Reservoirs. (page 11)
- Step 4. Unscrew the filter(s) to be replaced. (turn left)
- Step 5. Screw the corresponding replacement filter(s) into each slot. (turn right)
- Step 6. Turn on the Inline Ball Valve (ABV1K) (page 6 #8).
- Step 7. Close the Lower Front Door (page 6 #9).
- Step 8. After replacing the filter, prepare a bucket, remove Drain Line Cap (page 6 #13) at the back of the system, flush the system by running the water for at least 5 minutes and until the water is clean after installing a new filter(s). (page 9 > Operation >> Installation >>> Step 5-9)

PROBLEM	POSSIBLE CAUSE	SUGGESTED SOLUTION
The water dispenser is leaking	The drain cap and silicone seal are not secure.	Ensure seal is secure in drain plug (page 6 #13) and tighten drain cap.
Water is not hot or cold enough	The unit is unplugged.	Plug the power cord (page 6 #14) into the outlet.
	The hot water switch at the back of the unit is in the OFF position.	Activate hot water switch (page 6 #11) to the ON position.
	Indicator lights are not lit.	Connect the power cord (page 6 #14) to an electrical outlet; the cooling cycle starts automatically. Activate the hot water switch (page 6 #11) at the back of the unit.
	The circuit breaker in your home has tripped, or the fuse has blown.	Reset the breaker or replace the fuse.
	The hot water thermostat tripped (turned off).	Turn off the hot water switch (page 6 #11) for 15-30 minutes to allow the tank to cool, and then turn the switch back on. The temperature limit switch will reset automatically.
	The lower front door is not closed correctly.	Ensure the lower front door (page 6 #9) is closed adequately for proper operation.
The water dispenser is not	Possible air pocket.	Push down the dispenser buttons (page 6 #1, #2, #3) to prime the unit.
